# The Awesome Power of Torah

When Moshe Rabbeinu was in Shamayim to receive the Torah, the Malachim were jealous that Hashem was giving his precious Torah to fallible human beings. The Malachim refused to relinquish the Torah until Hashem explained that the Torah wasn't created for the Malachim. The Malachim don't have a Yetzer Horah, don't have parents to honour, don't have non-kosher food to avoid, and don't have a need to 'rest' on Shabbos.<sup>1</sup>

The Malachim

Rabbeinu Bechaya asks – the Gemara<sup>2</sup> states the Malachim do not have the trait of jealousy. This is

because the *Malachim*'s sole focus is to do what *Hashem* wants; how can they possibly be jealous of humans after Hashem decreed that the Torah should be given to them? Furthermore, wasn't it obvious that the Torah doesn't apply to them, as they don't have a *Yetzer Horah*?

Rabbeinu Bechaya explains, the term 'jealous' refers to the bewilderment the Malachim felt. Although they understood that they could not perform the Mitzvos of the Torah, they were baffled at how humans, imperfect and weak, could have access to a means of elevating oneself to heights that even the Malachim themselves cannot attain.

Imagine our *Neshama* resembles a light bulb and the brightness of our "light" is based on our learning, doing *Mitzvos*, and improving our *Middos*. Naturally, you would expect that the *Malachim's* "light" would be brilliant and dazzling because they don't have a *Yetzer Hara* and therefore always listen to Hashem. However, whenever *Klal Yisrael* learns Torah we connect to a colossal generator that causes our "light" to shine even brighter than that of the angels' "light."

The *Malachim* themselves recognize the stunning transformation that is caused by learning Torah. The Torah was concealed until a nation would be worthy of accepting this powerful gift. By understanding the reason for the *Malachim's* "jealousy," may we come to a deeper appreciation of the life changing Torah that we received on this day many years ago.

R' Elchonon responded, "The words of the *Gemara* illuminate one's mind and force him to think straight. After I studied a little, Hashem helped me to give the man sound advice."

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#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- Since the moment that Hashem created the world the existence of everything He created was dependent on *Bnei Yisrael* accepting 2448 years later.<sup>1</sup>
- Torah learning keeps the world going. Therefore if there were one second without Torah learning in the world, the world will return to nothingness.<sup>2</sup>
- Ever since the Torah came down from *Shamayim* it still retained its heavenly *Kedusha*. Thus it is forbidden to merely think in Torah when going to a soiled area.<sup>3</sup>
- The reason Chazal refer to understanding Torah as a Metziah<sup>4</sup> finding of a lost object is because understanding Torah is not really based on how smart we are. It is really based on putting in the effort trying and Hashem then does His part allows us to "find" or understand the Torah.<sup>5</sup>
